Thought for the Month

The day I kicked the bucket before the Pope arrived

It was Saturday 29th September 1979, and I was in a field, sitting at the sound desk inside a BBC Television outside broadcast vehicle.

I was in charge of the sound output, both radio and television, from the Drogheda site and was awaiting the arrival of Pope John Paul II, who was expected in a couple of hours.

All the meticulous planning had been done – all the television cables had been buried underground where necessary, everyone knew what they had to do during his visit. Approximately 300,000 of the faithful were on site hoping to get more than a glimpse of this revered person.

I had supplied the three microphones which were in front of the Pope's position, but the PA company had plugged them up on the stage. Something inside of me said that I should go and check for myself that they were all correct. So, I left my position and wearing my photograph pass I walked over to climb the steps up onto the stage.

I was prevented from climbing the steps by a policeman who claimed that my pass for all areas was insufficient for access. I explained how important it was that I was able to check the microphones and he conceded, as long as he accompanied me. So, both of us went up the steps to the stage area, which was covered with large billowing sheets of plastic to protect the red carpet in case it rained. As I clambered over the high flapping plastic my foot hit a concealed bucket of water which presumably had been left there to hold the plastic down. Imagine the scene of the two of us and a couple of others trying to coordinate and lift a large sheet of plastic containing a puddle of water and trying to replace it in the bucket. We successfully got some of it back in and I proceeded on my way the check the equipment.

The transmission went perfectly. During his homily the Pope spoke about the violence in Northern Ireland. *"On my knees I beg you to turn away from the paths of violence and return to the ways of peace."*

As well as Drogheda I also was responsible, a few days later on 1ST October, for the sound output of his visit to St Patrick's College, Maynooth, County Kildare, and also, a few years later, on 1st June 1982, during his visit to St. Andrew's College of Education in Bearsden, Glasgow. So having been blessed by a Pope three times, (*God bless all here*), I feel that my life

since then has been appropriately charmed. But don't worry Rector, your ministry has also had a significant and even greater influence on me.

I have successfully managed to avoid kicking any more buckets of water since.

Our sincere thanks to David for sharing this 'Thought' with us.

Ruth's choirs have been UTV Choir of the Year, Sainsbury's Choir of the Year, Songs of Praise Choir of the Year and RTE All-island choir of the Year. Ruth also enjoys the weekly lunchtime recitals in the college Chapel when young people get the chance

to perform pieces in a familiar and comfortable environment where they can gain confidence. Without a doubt, Ruth's most memorable event was The Coronation of King Charles III and Queen Camilla.

Ruth writes, 'I will miss the students and staff at MCB very much but I know that my wonderful colleague, and friend, Lynda Rolston, will do a great job'.

The office bearers attended the Mothers' Union Council meeting last month in Dromara Parish which is the home parish of Mavis our Diocesan President.

The units gave updated reports and here are a few details.

In 2025 the Trustees will step down and new members will be elected. The process for electing a new All Ireland President is beginning and will follow as directed by Mary Sumner House.

There are currently 35 branches registered in the Diocese but only 27 are active. In 2026, MU will celebrate 150 years. We have been asked to consider and forward any ideas to help Down and Dromore mark the occasion.

A summary of Diocesan finances can be viewed at our next meeting.

There is a MU communion service on the first Thursday of every month in Christchurch Cathedral Dublin. This year it was decided that every Diocese ought to have an annual communion service, one has been arranged for Thursday 1st August 11.45 in Down Cathedral.

Several events are planned for the summer including the prayer walk for Mary Sumner Day 9th August, I will give you details as they are issued.



You will find this job most rewarding – and this is your chance to have some control of what is heard – if you find the Rector's sermons are going on far too long, then you will have the power to fade him out!



The more people we have available to assist means that you might only have to look after one or two services a month. Other advantages include being able to sit at the back of the church. You will however have to arrive early to the service to check the equipment and be there for any rehearsals.

Your experience of mixing sound can be another line in your CV. We are an equal opportunities employer - anyone from a teenager to a granny is welcome – the usual non-negotiable volunteer fees apply.



If you are even slightly interested, but don't wish to commit just yet, then come and join us some Sunday morning and see for yourself how easy it is to provide the sound in the church and the recording.
